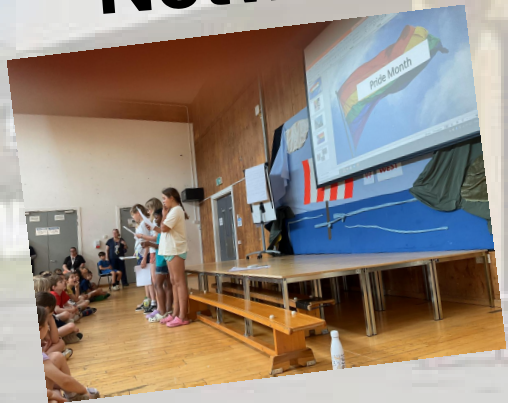

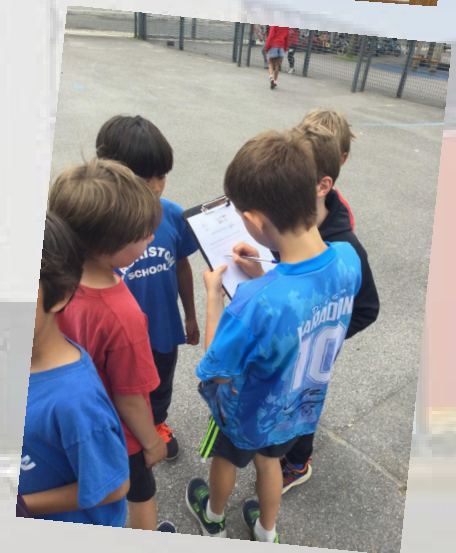
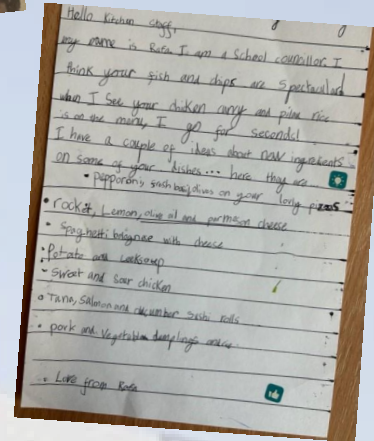




# School Council

# Pride Youth Network

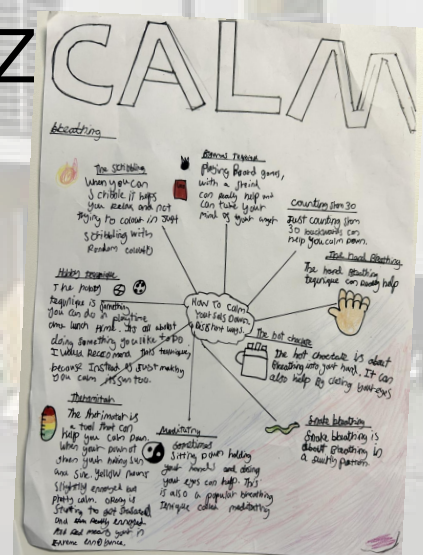
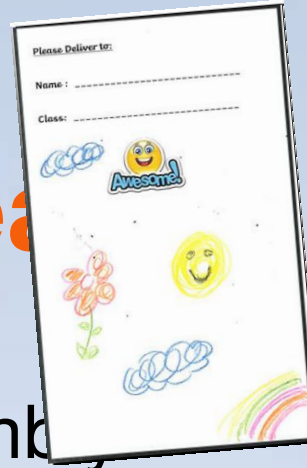
- Visited classes during LGBT History Month to present a class assembly about scientists in history who have faced discrimination.

# Ambassadors

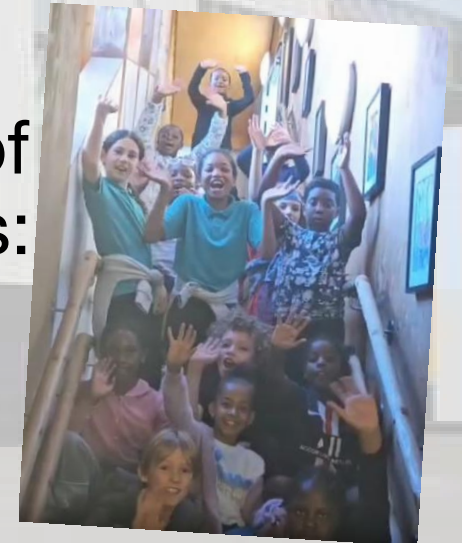
- Apply in Year 5 to be an Ambassador in Year 6
